

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

## PROJECT OF THE YEAR

#### **COMMERCIAL BUILDING \$5MILLION TO \$20MILLION**

## COCKRAM CONSTRUCTIONS AUSTRALIA

ACU Signadou Campus Veritas Building

Acting as a new hub for meeting and gathering, the newly built ACU Signadou Campus Veritas Building has brought new life to the Australian Catholic University Canberra Campus. The two-storey purpose built facility comprises of a new state of the art library, student café, multipurpose room, amenities and staff office. Sitting in the heart of the campus, it is designed to provide optimum flexibility to accommodate the evolving needs and requirements of the education environment. The welcoming common areas within the building are designed to encourage maximum collaboration, imagination and creativity for students and staff alike.

The campus remained fully operational during the construction of the building, posing a challenge which was overcome by Cockram Constructions Australia. Maintaining regular communication between various stakeholders was key to achieving this coordinated and collaborative outcome. Working within this environment required careful consideration when using the carpark and public spaces for crane set up and exclusion zones. High noise works had to be completed during prescribed times.

The welcoming common areas within the building are designed to encourage maximum collaboration, imagination and creativity for students and staff alike.





The workmanship, finishes and building materials were of a high calibre. The project involved the use of seven different ceiling types which were custom ordered and completed with different installation teams for each ceiling type. The spotted gum soffit sets a warm and welcoming mood at the North and South of the building, extending to the walkways that connect the building to the others on campus.

A key component of the design brief was ACU's commitment to reducing their carbon footprint during the process. ACU expressed their requirement to obtain a 5 Green Star rating. Using high spec glazing, thermal breaks in the framing and timber from forest certification schemes helped to achieve this. Cockram undertook several engineering changes throughout the project to ensure the final design was in line with ACU's budget.

Through collaboration, trust and transparency Cockram Constructions Australia was able to produce a building which is exemplary of magnificent quality. This has resulted in a welcoming space for students to access high quality amenities, equipment and learning spaces.

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#### **COMMERCIAL BUILDING LESS THAN \$5 MILLION**

#### PIER PROJECTS AND OZTAL ARCHITECTS

Shaw Wines Cellar Door

Located in Murrumbateman, the Shaw Wines Cellar Door's scale, complexity of design and key features create a modern environment for visitors to enjoy an entirely bespoke and exclusive experience. The Cellar Door is composed primarily of concrete, timber and glass. At the heart of the project is the concrete central spine which leads to the grand Cellar Door. The striking concrete wall spans 53 metres in length and divides the building into two sweeping wings. The external timber cladding was sourced from South America and is featured on the custom timber door at the main entrance, providing a warm and harmonious arrival. The project took 14 months to complete and reflects the impeccable craftsmanship of the build.

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#### **COMMERCIAL BUILDING \$20 MILLION TO \$50 MILLION**

#### HINDMARSH CONSTRUCTION AUSTRALIA

ANU Building 145

Set within the grounds of the Australian National University, Building 145 is home to a variety of disciplines within the University. Towering at six stories, it is now the tallest building on the campus and hosts more than 800 students. The aim of the project was to create a building which would allow for a collaborative environment.

A grand feature of the building is the 'collaborative stair' and walkway bridges which flow onto each floor within the open atrium. The façade of building 145 is complex and includes double glazed thermally broken glass, deep angled vertical blades and perforated metal screens. Hindmarsh Construction Australia achieved all of their clients desired outcomes while maintaining the heritage character of the university precinct.





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
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#### **COMMERCIAL BUILDING MORE THAN \$50 MILLION**

#### LENDLEASE BUILDING

Kambri (ANU Union Court Redevelopment)

The construction of Kambri has brought a host of new facilities to enhance the learning, cultural, physical and social experiences available at the Australian National University. Over a period of 26 months, with 18 of those being onsite, Lendlease constructed six buildings which house more than 40 retail premises, state of the art teaching facilities and accommodation for 450 students. A key feature of the project was to minimise the environmental impact of the building, this was achieved by using precast concrete elements that have 40% less embodied carbon than alternatives, delivery of a prefabricated brick façade, the first of its kind in Australia and using panels with greater insulated performance. The team used industry best practice to deliver an outstanding project.



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
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#### LANDSCAPE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION - COMMERCIAL

#### GLASCOTT LANDSCAPE & CIVIL

National Police Memorial

Situated in Kings Park on the shore of Lake Burley Griffin, the National Police Memorial is a tribute to the Australian Police Officers who have been killed on duty or died because of their duties. An outstanding and monumental feature of the memorial is the bronze wall which recognises the fallen police officers on individual commemorative 'touchstones'. The terrain pavement was cut from Austral black stone and a computer numerical control machine was used to cut lettering into the stone pieces. This was done while working alongside engineers in Germany to replicate existing lettering. The project was an outstanding success and completed before the National Police Memorial Remembrance Day Service.


#### **BREMA GROUP**

Macarthur House

The Macarthur House Demolition Project involved the demolition of a seven storey high tower with a further two storeys of plant rooms and adjoining three storey annex building. The demolition required a fully enclosed perimeter scaffold be in place during the process. It was initially proposed in the tender that a plant would be required to be craned onto the suspended floors and demolition of the building would occur from the top down. In consultation with WorkSafe ACT, structural engineers, INDESCO and the client, Brema Group found an alternate way to eliminate major high risks to the project and provide a safer demolition process.

Overall, the project was a great success and used innovative processes to ensure the safety of all involved.












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WHS - CIVIL

#### WODEN CONTRACTORS

Gundaroo Drive Stage 02

Woden Contractors were required to duplicate Gundaroo Drive between Gungahlin Drive Intersection and the Barton Highway. This involved working in an area where 23,000 vehicles pass through each day. The bulk of the pavement works for the widening of the existing carriageway were undertaken using a simple stop or slow traffic control method. This allowed the works to be completed ahead of time, in turn Woden Contractors were able to take advantage of existing road closures to begin work on the next element of the project, the bridgeworks, improving the safety for construction workers and the public. By using simple and effective methods to progress the works of this project, safety on the project was significantly improved.

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#### WHS - TARGETED RISK MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

#### GEOCON & PROJECT SIMPEL

Geocon implementation of Project Simpel

Working closely with Simpel, Geocon created their own application, resulting in a whole site and workplace WHS risk management solution. Key elements of the application include a central information repository, induction management process, regulatory compliance reporting, site access controls using QR codes and a communications platform to ensure ongoing enforcement of strict WHS protocols. The application was developed through consultation with various developers and builders to ensure it had universal market appeal. As a result of this great partnership, the application has enabled Geocon to streamline various aspects of the Regulations and Legislation in the ACT to ensure a higher rate of compliance is achieved.









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#### PROJECT DISPLAYING TECHNICAL DIFFICULTY OF INNOVATION

#### DELNAS METAL ROOFING

Facades to Lower Molonglo Water Quality Control Centre

Commissioned by the Principle Contractor Kynetic, Delnas Metal Roofing upgraded the roofing and facades of the Lower Molonglo Water Quality Control Centre. The requirements of the project were to replace to the cracked and faded fibre cement facades, rusted box guttering and outer roofing area to five of the facilities buildings. The project also involved the installation of roof access ladders, aluminium walkways and perimeter handrails to all five buildings. The environment of the project was a key factor in the complexities as it is the largest water treatment plant in inland Australia and operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The impeccable skill, workmanship and dedication of Delnas Metal Roofing ensured a high quality result.



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CIVIL - ROADWORKS

#### **HUON CONTRACTORS**

Cotter Road Stage 2 Duplication and Shared Path

Huon Contractors worked along the Cotter Road to duplicate more than 1.7km of roadway. A few of the key elements of the project included the installation of an asphalt reinforced geogrid, the construction of a 30 metre bridge, the demolition and hydro blasting of an existing bridge and the construction of a three-metre tall stone-clad noise wall which was 652 metres in length. The Cotter Road connects the Molonglo Valley with the Parliamentary Triangle and is used by over 25,000 vehicles a day. Huon Contractors implemented temporary traffic management plans to facilitate the continued use of the road, operating in off-peak hours only. Although the project was technically complex, meticulous planning allowed Huon Contractors to overcome any challenges that arose during construction.

## GUIDELINE ACT & TRANSPORT CANBERRA AND CITY SERVICES

Isabella Weir Upgrade

Guideline ACT was engaged by Transport Canberra and City Services to widen the existing concrete labyrinth weir and construct two new wetlands at Isabella pond. The aim of the project was to increase the spillway capacity of the weir to accommodate a one in 10,000 year flood event. Guideline ACT were able to utilise materials from the construction of the Weir to build the wetlands. The Isabella Weir now has double the overflow capacity following the extension of the existing reinforced concrete labyrinth wall.

The project, in total, involved 660 tonnes of reinforcement and 2300 cubic metres of concrete. Upon successful completion of the project, the Weir now provides safety to the Wetlands further downstream in turn, maintaining a natural filtration system for cleaner waterways.

## HUON CONTRACTORS, CALIBRE GROUP AND RIVERVIEW PROJECTS

Design and Construction of the Ginninderry Sewer Vortex Structure

Part of Ginninderry's Stage One Development required the intricate planning, design and construction of a sewer vortex to provide a sewer management solution for the first stages of the project. This involved Huon Contractors, Calibre Group and Riverview Projects working collaboratively to retrofit an existing sewer shaft with a vertical vortex structure. Working within strict time constraints, the task involved connecting the influent sewer pipe from the Ginninderry system, with the existing Ginninderra sewer tunnel, which was approximately 50 metres below ground level. The work was successfully completed in volatile environmental conditions alongside the live sewer tunnel.







#### SUSTAINABLE - CIVIL PROJECT

#### DOWNER EDI WORKS

AC14 Reconophalt

Consistently on the forefront of innovation, Downer EDI Works set out to produce a new, more environmentally friendly asphalt mix called Reconophalt. This innovative material is comprised of materials such as reclaimed asphalt pavement, recycled glass and recycled Tonerplas which incorporates toner from recycled printer cartridges as well as recycled plastic bags. Reconophalt also uses Warm Mix Asphalt technology to reduce energy requirements. By adopting the use Reconophalt as an alternative to traditional mixes, Downer EDI works are able to reduce the use of virgin quarry material by up to 30%. Reconophalt pavements have equal or greater long term performance as that of traditional pavements. Downer EDI works are leading the way for sustainable alternatives in road surfacing solutions.



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#### **CIVIL - SUBDIVISION**

## CORD CIVIL

Gungahlin Town Centre Infrastructure

Cord Civil commenced work on the Gungahlin Town Centre to expand and improve the infrastructure within the area. The project incorporated three design packages by Indesco, Aecom and Cardno. The works were completed in five stages which involved temporary traffic management, major sewer works as well as erosion and sediment controls. A key element of the project was environmental protection, this involved protecting heritage listed trees in the Mulangarri Grasslands Reserve. Challenges arose during the coordination of the three designs. This required extensive management when addressing the design interfaces. Cord Civil achieved this by developing a construction program that maintained continuity and minimised disruption to the public. While the technical complexities on the project were extensive, they were all overcome.



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





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#### **BEST USE OF MATERIAL - COMMERCIAL**

## PROJECT COORDINATION (AUSTRALIA)

Giralang Primary School - Hall Ceiling Replacement

This outstanding project was a challenge indeed and involved a complex brief of multiple deliverables, budget constraints and an occupied school environment. The refurbishment of the works needed to suit the numerous purposes of the hall which is used by the school and wider community. The project required the removal of the flat retro fitted ceiling before the original raked ceilings could be re-established. Adding to the complexities of this project were the key considerations involving the heritage requirements of the building as well as the moral rights of the original architect, Enrico Taglietti. Project Coordination displayed exemplary craftsmanship and skill on this project.

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## CAPEZIO COPELAND, 4SITE & NIKIAS DIAMOND

**Hume Office Fitout** 

After being approached by 4site to design the interiors of their new showroom and office workspace, Capezio Copeland and Nikias Diamond set out to provide 4site with an inspiring and versatile environment. The result of this incredible partnership was a showroom and workspace which seamlessly merge. The bold natural stone ice green marble reception counter is a unique feature within the space and unifies the contrasting materials surrounding it. It is evident upon entry that every space, material and fixture has been carefully considered and selected including reconstituted stone and brass benchtops, moulded solid surfaces with timber inlays and exquisite joinery. The extraordinary finishes and details are a testament to the outstanding quality of this project.

## AFFINITY CONSTRUCTIONS (AUST)

Australian Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) Office Fitout

With only eight weeks to deliver this \$4.5 million project, Affinity Constructions produced a sophisticated and stylish fitout for the Australian Fisheries Management Authority. The team worked over long and hard days to ensure this seemingly unachievable feat would be met. Every element of the project was carefully considered to represent the Australian waterways and ocean. Design features within the fitout included angled glass, metalwork and acoustic panelling which represents the lines of a ships hull. The creativity of this project was abundant from the rhombus shaped acoustic panelling to writable glass surfaces in an assortment of blue and grey shades. A once dull office was transformed into a welcoming and creative space.

## CONSTRUCTION CONTROL

ANU RN Robertson Refurbishment

After serving its purpose for almost five decades, the once decrepit RN Robertson building in the College of Sciences precinct at the Australian National University was brought back to life during this adaptive re-use project. Through collaboration with various stakeholders, two research schools were brought together into one energy efficient and functional building. Sustainability was a key consideration in this project and where possible, ceilings were omitted, and existing finishes were repaired and retained. This included salvaging timber to reuse within the fitout, refurbishing furniture items and stripping the existing atrium tiles. The remarkable efforts of Construction Control have resulted in a building which serves its flexible purpose to harbour first class research laboratories, common meeting spaces and offices.





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
