Certificate III in Carpentry - CPC30211

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The CPC30211 Certificate III in Carpentry covers the essentials skills and knowledge required commence your career as a qualified tradesman in the construction industry. The CPC30211 Certificate III in Carpentry qualification is available through an Australian Apprenticeship arrangement.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Start date: Block training commences in January and is delivered at various dates throughout the calendar year.

Course length: 3 - 4 years full time

Location: Skills Centre – 1 Iron Knob Street Fyshwick ACT 2609

Course Times: Training is scheduled in 6 x 1 week blocks – 8.00 am – 4.00 pm

Study mode: Full Time

Training: Apprentices complete six, one-week training blocks over the course of the year. Your training with MBAGT will include both theory lessons in our classrooms and practical lessons in the outdoor workshop.

OUTCOMES

This qualification provides a trade outcome in Carpentry, covering residential and commercial applications.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Induction Training for Construction Work (ASCC 2007) is required before entering a construction work site. Achievement of unit CPCWHS1001 covers this requirement. This qualification is suitable for an Australian Apprenticeship pathway.

It is an MBA Group Training requirement for those wishing to undertake this course that they must:

- Complete a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) assessment and a pre- enrolment interview and;
- Complete an Asbestos Awareness course mandated by ACT Government

All students undertaking this course must have or obtain a Unique Student Identifier (USI) and provide this to the RTO prior to, or at, enrolment.

MBA Group Training Ltd is authorised under section 9 of the Student Identifier Regulation Act 2014 to collect or use a student identifier.

CAREER OPPORTUNITITES

This qualification provides a trade outcome in carpentry, covering work in residential and commercial applications.

Occupational titles may include:

• Carpenter

The qualification has core units of competency requirements that cover common skills for the construction industry, as well as a specialist field of work.

PATHWAYS

On successful completion of this qualification participants will receive a trade certificate which satisfies the licensing required for relevant states. Trades people may choose to work as an employee, subcontractor or with further experience may work as a leading hand or fore person. MBAGT offers training in Certificate IV Building courses that can lead to supervisory and management roles with larger firms or gaining of a builder's license.
