# Top Canberra civil construction projects honoured at CCF Earth Awards

On Friday 30 May 2025, the ACT's most outstanding civil construction projects were celebrated at the 2025 Civil Contractors Federation (CCF) Earth Awards at Hotel Realm in Barton, in an exciting awards night with over 300 guests from across the civil construction industry.

The CCF Earth Awards shine a spotlight on the outstanding civil construction projects that have shaped Canberra and the region over the past year.

**2025 Project of the Year** was awarded to **Huon Contractors, Egis Consulting and Riverview Projects** for their delivery of Macnamara EDP 1 Package 1, a major subdivision that lays the groundwork for a new Canberra suburb in Macgregor, ACT. The project featured subdivision of lots for 383 residential units, along with infrastructure development, earthworks, and environmental safeguards, all while prioritising safety, training, and community involvement.

**Miriam de Kievith of Guideline ACT** was awarded this year's **Outstanding Woman in Civil Construction**, recognising her remarkable journey from SPARK Women in Civil program participant, to labourer and eventually, to her key management role at Guideline ACT.

**Guideline ACT** also took out a significant win for their Molonglo Valley Interceptor Sewer Odour Mitigation Project. **Complex Co.** received accolades for their work on the John Gorton Building Hydraulic and Intersection Works, along with a Judges' Commendation for rehabilitating the ACT netball courts in Lyneham and Stirling.

Anna Neelagama, CEO of the Civil Contractors Federation of the ACT, emphasised the importance of recognising these significant projects.

'Civil construction is the backbone of our city and region's development,' she said. 'The CCF Earth Awards give us a chance to highlight the projects that set the foundation for our future suburbs, provide infrastructure and amenities for our communities, and improve our lives in countless ways.'

'There is currently a reduced pipeline for civil projects. This year's Earth Awards were incredibly competitive and high quality with two additional commendations delivered.'

'Our focus remains firmly on ensure that local civil contractors continue to forge the new roads, infrastructure and suburbs for the ACT and region.'
